State and National Updates

Budget Update

- State budget deliberations began in Legislature's 16-member Joint Finance Committee on May 6
- Republican members removed 380 items from Governor Evers' proposed budget, totaling \$3 billion in revenue sources
- Republicans plan to work from the current state budget as a template instead of Evers' budget

Among Items Removed:

- A ban on vaping in schools
- Legalizing medicinal and recreational marijuana
- Requiring background checks on all gun purchases, including those arranged online or at gun shows
- Banning police from using no-knock warrants
- Creating a \$2.9 million program to pay for driver ed classes for students who live in poverty
- Expanding Badgercare (Medicaid) by accepting federal funds
- Creation of equity offices within all state departments

Next Steps

- Joint Finance Committee will continue meeting to craft legislature's version of the 2021-23 budget
- When budget passes the legislature, Gov. Evers can use partial veto to make additional changes
- June 30- current fiscal year ends

DHS Creates Office of Health Equity

- The new Office of Health Equity will coordinate existing and new efforts on equity and inclusion across DHS; it will:
 - ◆ Implement strategies to build an infrastructure and culture committed to equity and inclusion.
 - ◆ Provide statewide leadership for policy measures that aim to improve the health of vulnerable populations in Wisconsin.
 - ◆ Assure coordination of efforts intended to reduce health disparities.
 - ◆ Minimize the impacts of health disparities in our communities by evaluating and proposing changes to DHS policies and budget.
 - ◆ Create an extensive network of community and agency partners, both formal and informal. Fostering these types of community partnerships will not only extend the reach of our work but also enrich our efforts by centering diverse perspectives.
 - ◆ Provide data analysis to help leadership and program staff make data informed decisions on policy areas that affect millions of Wisconsinites.

Biden-Harris Administration Invests \$7 billion in Public Health Workforce

- What it does:
 - ◆ Invest \$4.4 billion to surge public health staffing for continued COVID-19 response work
 - ◆ Help states and localities increase their public health staffing and expertise
 - ◆ Launch a public health AmeriCorps
 - ◆ Recruit and train public health leaders
 - ◆ Build the laboratory workforce and capacity for future outbreaks
 - ◆ Create a new program to modernize the public health workforce

Public Health Workforce Investment

- Wisconsin DHS anticipates receiving \$1m-\$1.5m annually for the next five years as part of this funding to support STI and HIV DIS at the state health department and local health departments

- Newly-included items:
 - ◆ Inclusion of Descovy, 2-1-1 for MSM, and Cabotegravir

 - ◆ Text specific to Cabotegravir was added to several sections
